I was thinking about Labor Day as we move into September. Most years in the past, as we approached Labor Day we were focused on the students getting back into class. This year they are already in place and the learning has begun. The change in the calendar gave me an opportunity to think about Labor Day, not the Labor Movement focus that initiated the day, but just the idea of labor. Labor, the ability to do work, is a gift from God. Sometimes it may not feel that way. If we are having trouble getting along with co-workers, the boss is breathing down our neck or we are just simply tired, we may think of work as a necessary evil, a drudgery. But rather than just endeavoring to put food on the table, God has given us the opportunity to not just earn the bread we eat, but to find meaning and purpose in the things we do. When I was a seminary student, I worked in the Sports Department of the Louisville Courier-Journal newspaper. I received a paycheck every two weeks that I used to buy food, pay for my rent, tuition and books. Sometimes it was a struggle to get up and go to an 8:00 a.m. class when I had worked until after midnight the night before, but then I would walk through the classroom building or the dining hall and see a student, or perhaps a professor, sitting and reading the newspaper that had been delivered that morning. As I saw them reading the paper, I would look at it and think, "I had a part in putting that together." There is a sense of meaning, of accomplishment in that. When we look at our work as a calling, a "vocation" that God has given us, we can view our toil as a source of meaning, of purpose.

There was a time when young people prepared for a "career". Today, more often than not we do our preparation in hopes of finding a "job." The changing attitudes toward work call us to ask ourselves the question, "How do I view the work I do? Am I doing a job to earn a paycheck or am I engaging in a career that ultimately makes a difference for the glory of God?" In recent days the Henrico County Schools Adult Education Center moved to their new environs on the first floor of the Regency Square property, our neighbor on the next block. One of the engaging things about the new center is the fact that they kept many of the display windows from the former retail establishments. In those places there are displays showing mannequins dressed as firefighters, nurses, technicians and the like. It is an invitation to students (and potential students) to enroll for more meaningful reasons than simply earning a GED or learning specific job skills. It is an invitation for those who walk by to see themselves in a meaningful career. I like to think of this as an invitation to Christians to take a similar view of our work, like that reflected in Colossians 3:17...Whatever you do in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through him to God the Father." As God's children, let's view our work, whether we are actively employed or retired, as an opportunity to exercise the gifts God has given us, a chance to build God's kingdom on earth, as it is in heaven. That's how we all can have a "Happy Labor Day."
